## RCFB Foundation 2020 Scholarship Deadline is February 12th

The Randolph County Farm Bureau Foundation was formed in 1994. The purpose for the Foundation is to promote agricultural education. The importance of educating the general public about the agriculture industry is crucial moving forward. Scholarships awarded each year are based on application completion, financial need, involvement within the agriculture industry, and future plans.

To be eligible for consideration, an applicant must:

- Be a high school senior graduating in May of 2020, or a current college student.
- Be a member or child of a member of the Randolph County Farm Bureau since at least January 1, 2019.
- Be accepted or plan to enroll as a

full-time student in post-secondary education within an Agriculture curriculum.

- Exhibit potential for successful completion of course of study, 2.0 minimum GPA.
- Be a resident of Randolph County.

Deadline for all requirements is February 12, 2020. The application is available on our website at <https://rcfb.org/rcfbfoundation/2020applications.html>.

At 7:15 p.m., Charles Schupbach declared the meeting to order. President Schupbach gave recognition to Ratzkeller's and the Butcher's Block for the great meal. Questionnaires on the table were mentioned and feedback was requested.

# Governmental Affairs Committee Report

It has been a hectic year within Governmental Affairs as there were five Action Requests sent out within 2018-2019 regarding the following: Lame Duck Farm Bill, Final Passage of Farm Bill, Clean Water Rule, State Progressive Income Tax, and USMCA.

In addition to the Action Requests, we had committee members attend the Illinois Farm Bureau Governmental Affairs Conference in Springfield, IL. Myself, Dean Campbell, and Heidi Smith attended from Randolph County Farm Bureau, alongside with District 16 IAA Director, Steve

Stallman. While at this conference, we had conversation with Senator Melinda Bush and Representative Jerry Costello II.

In early spring, the Randolph County Farm Bureau got together with their county elected officials for their annual "Evening in the Country," hosted at the farm of Wayne & Jamie Keller, near Steeleville. Many things are going on in the county and this event allows both the county officials and the Farm Bureau leadership to update the other on issues. 42 individuals attended this year's event.

The Governmental Affairs Committee also partners with the

Lower Kaskaskia Stakeholders, Inc. (LKSI) to provide volunteers and ice cream for the Annual Barge Tour. This year, the barge left from the Kaskaskia Lock and Dam Site in Modoc. We provided our homemade ice cream which was a huge hit for those in attendance.

In addition, the Randolph County Farm Bureau sends at least one representative to attend the County Commissioner Meetings. This year, we have attended at least one per month. This helps the County

Board and County Farm Bureau stay in touch and cooperate on issues pertaining to the county.

We also sent numerous letters and emails to our legislators encouraging them to vote on issues that directly affect agriculture. We have continued that all year long. We highly encourage you to help make a difference by signing up with FB ACT. This program informs you when a major vote or decision is going to take place through a simple text, email, or

phone call. Details about the bill are sent directly to you, so you can take action and contact your state or national legislators.
